¹ The original 2012 list included Americans for Tax Reform, which had not provided information about whether the contribution or any portion of it was non-deductible prior to the finalization of the list. Therefore, the entire amount of the contribution was disclosed. Since publication, the organization has provided information that none of the contribution was non-deductible, and the list has been amended accordingly.

² With respect to groups organized under section 501(c)(4) and 501(c)(6) of the Internal Revenue Code, in the event our aggregate annual contributions paid to any such group exceeds \$50,000, we have disclosed the non-deductible portion of the aggregate annual contributions paid to such groups, to the extent that information is disclosed to the RAI companies by the recipient, as required by law.

Additionally, if a 501(c)(4) organization reports that 75% or more of our aggregate annual contributions to such group was used for non-deductible purposes, we have disclosed the entire amount of our annual contribution, even if less than \$50,000. (Amounts falling in this latter category are marked by an asterisk.)
