

Local procurement at the national, regional, and local scales

MAKE A POSITIVE CONTRIBUTION

Kinross measures its benefit footprint in host countries both by category (payments to suppliers, governments, workforce, and community contributions) and by

geographic scale. For each mining operation we define a local, regional and rest of country, or national, level (see table).

Notes: a) population data are from public sources for the year 2018; b) for Tasiast we report the benefit footprint solely at the national level, including any regional and local payments within the total.

For Benefit Footprint reporting purposes, “local” applies to vendors either registered as businesses or with their main place of business (e.g., office, warehouse, factory), within the appropriate “local” administrative unit (this varies by site but generally corresponds to municipality, county, or district); as

“regional” within the sub national administrative unit (generally corresponding to state or provincial level); and as “national” for all other spending within the host country (e.g., other states/provinces or in the capital). “International” refers to spending with offshore suppliers.
