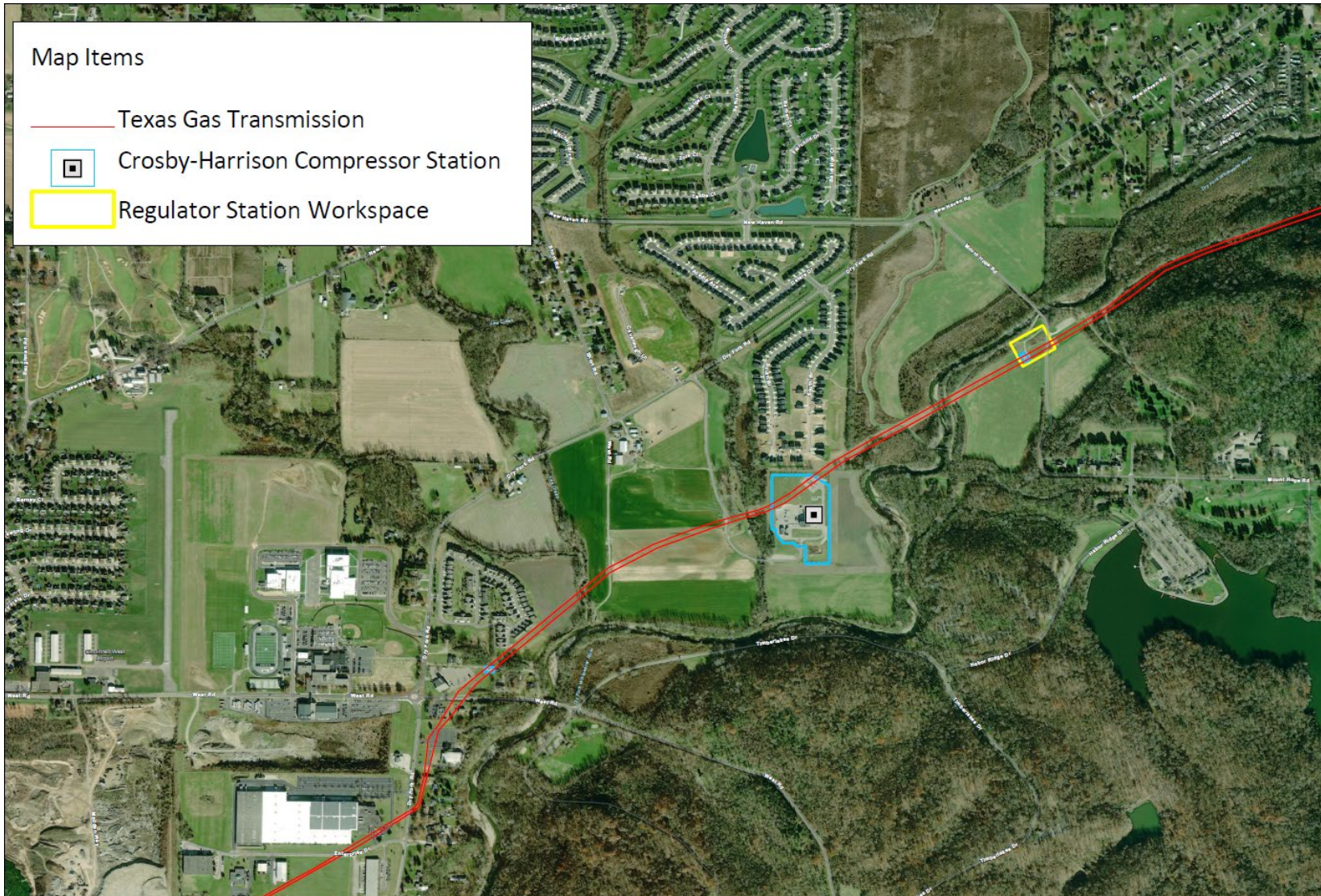
Introduction to Texas Gas

- Texas Gas Transmission, LLC (Texas Gas) is an interstate natural gas transportation and storage company.
- Subsidiary of Boardwalk Pipelines, LP.
- Texas Gas has approximately 500 employees system-wide.
- Regulated by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC).
- Texas Gas contributed approximately \$4.3M to Ohio and approximately \$2M to Hamilton County in 2024.

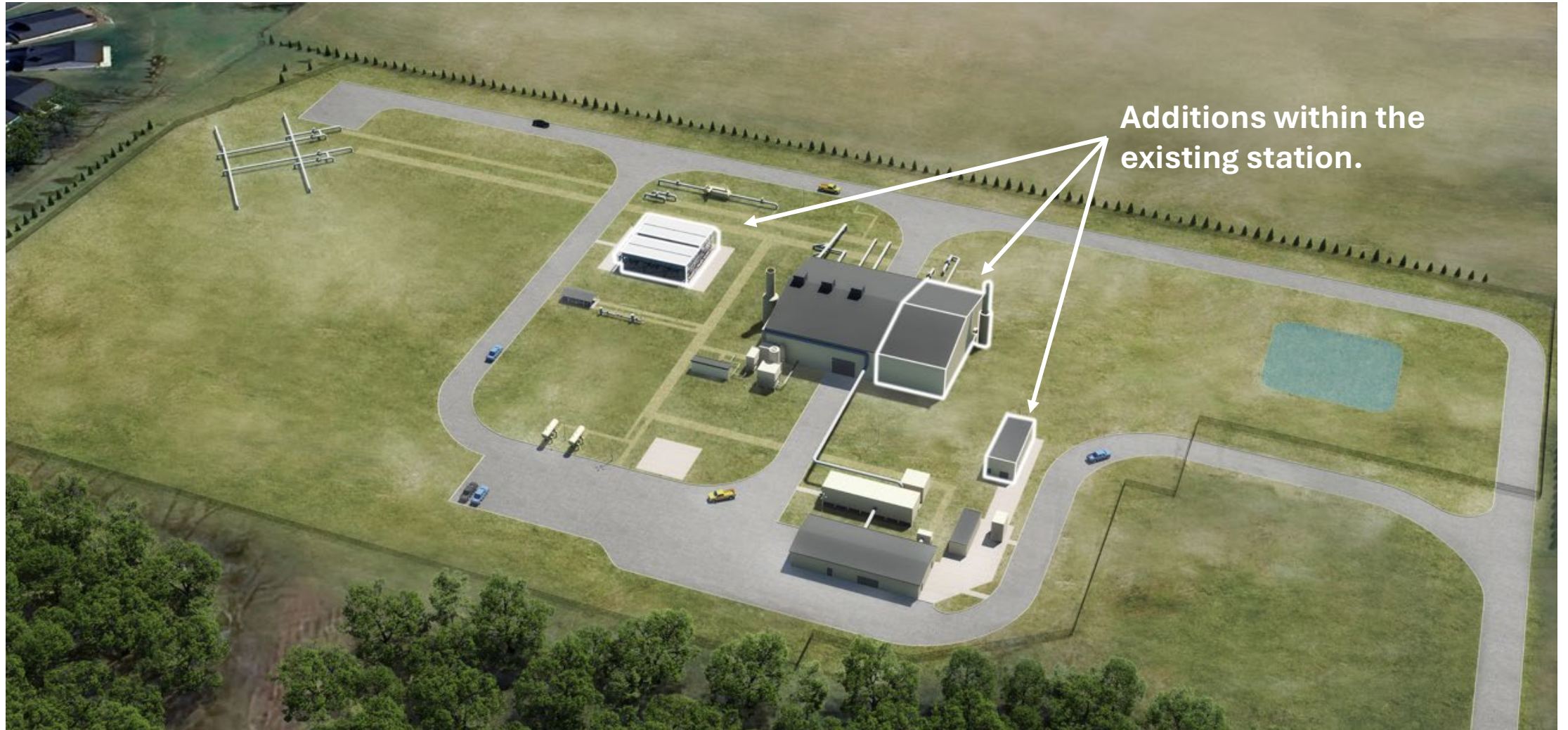
Carnation Project Overview

- **Scope:**
 - Install an additional compressor unit at Texas Gas's existing Crosby-Harrison Compressor Station building in Crosby Township.
 - Extend existing building by approximately 60-feet to accommodate new unit.
 - Install additional regulator units at Texas Gas's existing regulator station near New Haven, Ohio.
- **Purpose:**
 - Enhances capacity to meet growing energy demands in the tri-state area.
 - Supports delivery of reliable natural gas to homes and businesses.
