

2025 U.S. Political Engagement Policy and Statement

1 This U.S. Political Engagement Policy and Statement describes the two types of political
2 engagement by the Company. The first is lobbying, which includes both direct
3 communications with government officials by the Company as well as advocacy by other
4 organizations (i.e., indirect lobbying) that receive financial support from the Company. The
5 second is campaign contributions to candidates for elected office, political parties, political
6 committees, and other organizations that use the contributions for campaign-related
7 purposes.

8 The Company's policy is to participate in public policymaking by informing government
9 officials about our positions on issues significant to the Company and our customers. The
10 Company conducts this lobbying in the context of existing and proposed laws, legislation,
11 regulations, and policy initiatives, and includes commerce, intellectual property, trade, data
12 privacy, transportation, sustainability, artificial intelligence, web services, space policy,
13 healthcare, and other areas. Relatedly, the Company constructively and responsibly
14 participates in the U.S. electoral process by making campaign contributions. The goal of the
15 Company's political engagement is to promote the interests of the Company and our
16 customers, and the Company makes such decisions in accordance with the processes
17 described in this U.S. Political Engagement Policy and Statement, without regard to the
18 personal political preferences of the Company's directors, officers, or employees. Click here

20 **Review and Approval Process**

21 The Company's Vice President of Public Policy reviews and approves each campaign
22 contribution made with Company funds or resources to, or in support of, any candidate,
23 political campaign, political party, political committee, or public official in any country, or to
24 any other organization for campaign-related purposes, to ensure that it is lawful and
25 consistent with the Company's business objectives and public policy priorities. The
26 Company's Chief Global Affairs & Legal Officer, who oversees our global public policy
27 organizations, and the Audit Committee of the Board of Directors annually review this U.S.
28 Political Engagement Policy and Statement, related procedures, and a report on all of the
29 Company's campaign contributions and lobbying expenses, including donations made to
30 other organizations that may engage in indirect lobbying on behalf of the Company.

31 **2025 Political Engagement**

32 In 2025, the Company complied with all applicable regulations requiring public disclosure of
33 corporate political activity.

34 *Campaign Contributions*

35 In 2025, the Company did not make federal contributions to political parties or 527
36 organizations, or in support or opposition of any campaigns, and did not make any federal
37 or state independent expenditures for campaign-related purposes. In 2025, the Company
38 made non-federal contributions to candidates, political committees, 527 organizations, and
39 ballot initiatives in the amounts disclosed in Annex A to this U.S. Political Engagement Policy
40 and Statement.

41 *Amazon Political Action Committee*

42 The Company has formed a political action committee (PAC) funded solely by voluntary
43 contributions from some of the Company's eligible employees and shareholders (and their
44 spouses). The PAC's activities are subject to federal regulation, including detailed public
45 disclosure requirements. The PAC files regular public reports with the Federal Election
46 Commission (FEC), and campaign contributions to and by the PAC are required to be
47 disclosed. These reports are publicly available on the FEC website at

49 *U.S. Lobbying Activities*

50 In 2025, the Company spent approximately \$17.73 million on federal lobbying activities,
51 which are reported to the House and Senate:

53 In 2025, our spending related to the Company's government relations efforts in all states
54 (non-federal) and Washington, D.C., was approximately \$9.66 million. Specific amounts
55 spent per jurisdiction are included in Annex A to this U.S. Political Engagement Policy and
56 Statement, as disclosed on applicable state and local websites, such as those maintained by
57 secretaries of state, state ethics and public disclosure commissions, state legislatures, and
58 other state and local authorities.

59 *Trade Associations, 501(c)(4) Social Welfare, and Other Organizations*

60 The Company contributes to certain trade associations, coalitions, charities, and 501(c)(4)
61 social welfare organizations, many of which engage in indirect lobbying on behalf of the
62 Company by communicating with policymakers on issues important to their members. All
63 organizations receiving such payments of \$10,000 or more made through the Company's
64 Public Policy Office in 2025 are disclosed in Annex A to this U.S. Political Engagement Policy
65 and Statement. The Company may not agree with all the positions of each organization, its
66 leaders, or its other supporters, but believes that the Company's support will help advance
67 policy objectives aligned with our interests.
