

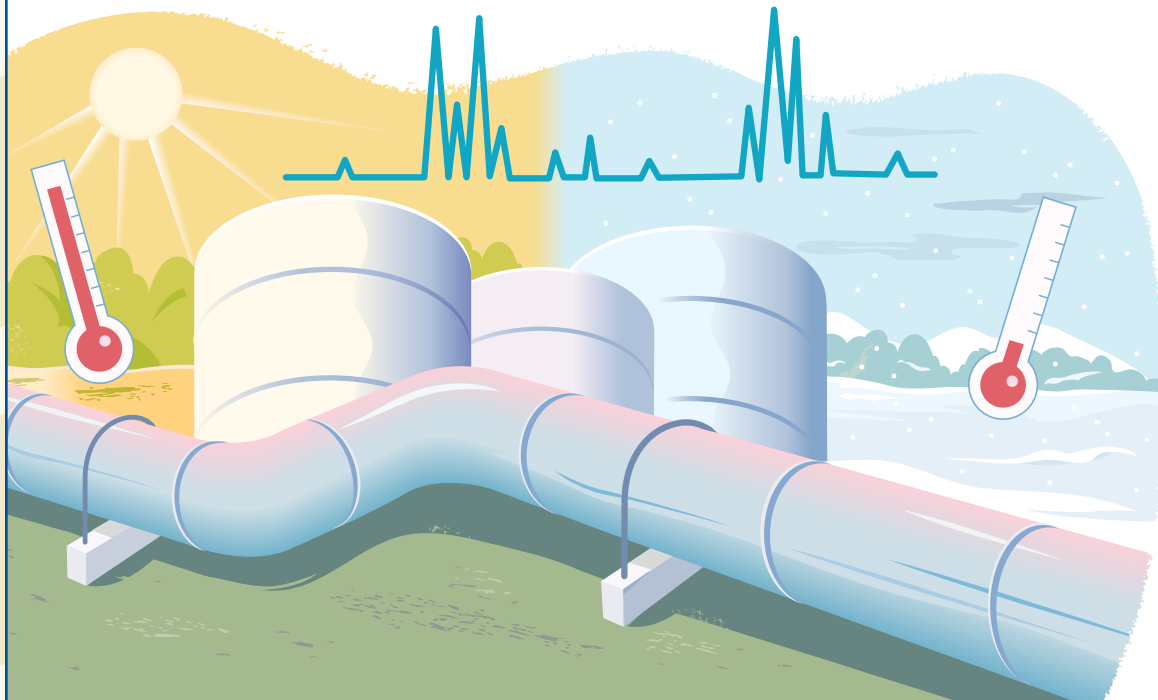
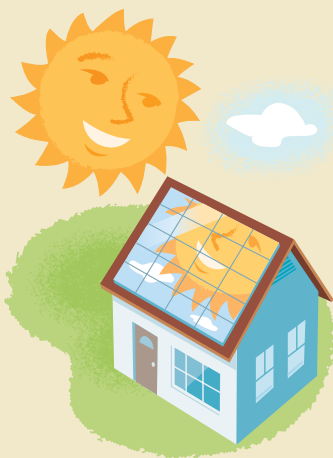
Company Partners On Solar Program

Earlier this year, Dominion Energy Solutions, in partnership with Henrico County, Va., and QTS Data Centers, launched a \$5 million rooftop solar program for income-qualifying Henrico County residents.

Eligible applicants must be homeowners in Henrico County with a household income at or below the region's median income level and must have a home suitable for solar energy.

So far, 80 Henrico homeowners have enrolled in the Solar Access Henrico program, which offers clean energy and provides potential energy bill savings for families in need.

Dominion Energy Is Investing In Reliable Generation

Electricity demand is on the rise in Virginia and South Carolina, where additional generating resources are needed to adequately supply industrial, commercial, governmental, and residential customers, particularly on the hottest and coldest of days.

So-called peakers — usually powered by clean-burning natural gas — can ramp up quickly to supply power when it is needed most.

In South Carolina, a peaking modernization effort is underway to provide peaking power in the Charleston, Columbia, and Aiken areas. A project in Berkeley County has been completed, and one is nearly finished in Fairfield County. Work in Aiken County is expected to begin soon, with an anticipated completion date in 2028.

In Virginia, 15 shovel-ready, company-owned power generation projects — including capacity uprates and a new gas combustion turbine — totaling more than 500 MW (enough to serve 125,000 homes and businesses) have been approved by PJM Interconnection, the regional grid operator, as part of its Reliability Resource Initiative. The company has also filed for approval of the Chesterfield Energy Reliability Center, an approximately 1,000-MW natural gas peaking plant, located at the current Chesterfield Power Station. Subject to regulatory approvals, the project is expected to commence operations in 2029.

Your company's philanthropic arm, the Dominion Energy Charitable Foundation, awarded more than \$10 million to 352 nonprofit organizations across six states in its spring 2025 grant cycle.

To Solar for Squirrels

Dominion Energy plans to install more than 1,700 solar panels — enough to power 250 homes and businesses — on the roof and parking lot of the Richmond Flying Squirrels' baseball stadium, which is currently under construction in the City of Richmond. If approved by regulators, the solar project is anticipated for completion before the 2027 season.
